1) Strategic Planning of the Centre's Training and Spirituality Programme

- Liaising with both the Centre Director and Centre Manager to ensure the focus of the Centre's spirituality programme:
 - o is alert to and meeting contemporary need
 - o maintains an ecumenical approach
 - o is rooted in the spirituality of Ignatius and Mary Ward
- Oversee effective long-term planning and delivery of Ignatian courses and training (including anticipating need for, identifying and mentoring of new tutors, retreat givers and supervisors)
- Contribute to the preparation of the Centre's annual Programme with respect to spirituality content

2) Delivery of Training and Programme Content

- Seek opportunities to make sure the Centre's spirituality training remains fresh, creative and meets contemporary need
- Act as lead for the planning and delivery of spiritual accompaniment training (including its creative development to ensure it remains contemporary, engaged with current world issues, and accessible across denominations and generations)
- Contribute to the session delivery on the Personal and Spiritual Development and Spiritual Conversation courses as required
- Contribute to the development and delivery of other non-Ignatian programme items as appropriate and capacity allows (short courses/workshops etc.)

 Offer one-to-one accompaniment and supervision to a maximum of 15% of weekly hours as capacity allows

3) Line Management and Team Building

- Line-manage the Lead Trainer and Spirituality Worker
- Work with the Lead Trainer in developing capacity to deliver Ignatian training, courses and retreats, including:
 - mentoring and support of less experienced spirituality team members and tutors
 - developing a mentoring programme for bringing on those with a charism for offering the Spiritual Exercises (19th Annotation) and retreat work (retreats in daily life, individually guided retreats)
 - building up the newly created York Ignatian Spirituality Network (YISAN) of Ignatian accompaniers and supervisors, including ongoing development of network members
- Support the Centre Director and Centre Manager in cultivating a positive and forward-thinking team vision and inclusive working culture

4) Networking, Liaison and Pastoral Support

Working collaboratively with the Centre Director and Centre Manager:

- Take the lead in ensuring St Bede's is an active member of the wider Ignatian network in Britain and Ireland:
 - seek opportunities for collaboration with other Ignatian centres where appropriate
 - participate in Ignatian conferences, nationwide training and ongoing development
- Contribute to networking with other pastoral/spirituality centres in the UK and wider
- Contribute to maintaining ecumenical links with local diocesan and parish contacts
- Contribute to messaging on the website and other social media channels with respect to spirituality content

5) Personal Development

- Engage in ongoing training and formation as appropriate
- Make an annual 8 day individually guided retreat
- Be in receipt of personal spiritual accompaniment
- Undertake regular supervision for retreat work and accompaniment of others
